MESSAGE FROM THE MEMBERSHIP MANAGER

I thought it might be helpful to let the membership know the process I use to notify those with expiring memberships. On the 15th of the month, I instruct our email system to send a notification to all those people whose membership will expire between the time the email is sent and the last day of the following month.

For example, On October 15th the email system was instructed to send a notification to all those people whose membership would expire between October 15 and November 30th. The email that was sent informs you that the membership will expire soon. It also advises that there is a 15-day grace period beyond expiration in which you may renew without incurring a penalty. The method to renew and the renewal amount are also spelled out.

If the grace period is exceeded, the ability to renew is removed and it is necessary to contact the Membership Manager indicating that you do wish to renew. With notification to the Membership Manager, the renewal capability is reactivated but there is also a \$25.00 late renewal fee attached. Also, if the grace period is exceeded your electronic gate access card is disabled. Once the renewal fee is paid the card will be reactivated but it could take up to 2 weeks before it is reactivated.

Ultimately, it is the member's responsibility to know when their membership will expire. The email that is sent also tells you how to determine exactly when the membership expires. By sending notification on the 15th of the month, to all those whose membership will expire within 6 weeks those who don't renew with the first notice will receive a second notice.

PROJECT APPLESEED PISTOL CLINIC

Coming November 4th and 5th is something new from our friends at Project Appleseed. Some of you are familiar with the rifle marksmanship programs they run on our outdoor ranges periodically over the summer and fall. Project Appleseed will be running a pistol clinic at FLSC on our indoor range.

Learn the basics of handgun safety, accuracy, and control. All the fundamentals needed to safely handle a handgun will be covered. Skills taught include proper stance, sighting the target, trigger control, Natural Point of Aim, speed drills, and many other topics.

You need at least 250 rounds of ammo for the one-day event or 500 rounds for the two-day event. If using a semi-auto bring at least two magazines. If using a revolver bring a speed loader. To register go to: <u>https://appleseedinfo.org/</u>

COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING

Fenton's final match for 2023 took place on October 8. It was a rather cold day, but seven brave cowboys and cowgirls came out to play. Considering the weather and the fact that the SASS National Championship 3-day match was going on at the same time, it was not a bad turnout.

We shot 5 stages. One of them was a clone from the 25th anniversary Range War. Going forward we hope to have at least one stage in each monthly match in 2024 that will be based on a stage from a major match.

As there were so few shooters, everybody finished first in their category. Rip Rocker (not his real name) took first place and shot a clean match. Not bad since this is his first year of playing cowboy. At each match there is a drawing to receive a certificate for a free match in the future. This month the new cowgirl shooter Bourbon Betty (not her real name) took home the honors. She and her husband Rip Rocker registered for the match at the same time so either could have won the certificate. Betty claimed it before her husband had a chance to grab it.

We are looking forward to the 2024 season and hope to see a bunch of our cowboy friends at each match. We will probably continue to shoot on the second Sunday of each month beginning in April (weather permitting) and continuing into October (again, weather permitting). Our fees will be the same as the 2023 fees: \$14.00 for Wolverine Rangers members or Fenton Lakes Sportsman's Club members; \$5.00 for those under 18 years old or for those who have never shot a cowboy match at Fenton; \$20.00 for all others.

JUNIOR RIFLE LEAGUE

Jr. Rifle League is underway and runs through March of 2024. This activity uses the indoor range every Tuesday evening from 5:30PM - 9:30PM. the program is open to youngsters between the ages of 10 and 18 years old, both members and non-members can participate. BOWLING PINS

The FLSC Bowling Pin Shoots are in full swing through the fall and winter! Open to members and the public, it's .22 rimfire with either rifle or pistol and both optic and iron sight are allowed. We shoot (10) racks of (5) pin sets. So, dust off that .22 and bring the family out for some quality shooting time. This sport is very beginner-friendly!!! Multiple entries are allowed. Many people shoot twice or more.

Like last season are scheduling "flights", so you can select your time slot to show up and shoot. There is a 6:00pm, 6:30pm, 7:00pm, 7:30pm and 8:00pm squad. Just select the time(s) you want to shoot. Just sign up for as many slots as you like. There are 12 slots per flight. Links to sign up are on the club calendar.

SPORTING CLAYS

Clay Fundraisers. Over the past few years, we have had an increased interest in using the clays course for various fundraisers, we have had 3 scheduled this year. When we have a fundraiser the transmitters on the course have their programming adjusted and will not accept Red or Blue cards.

You can still shoot but you will need to sign up and pay the required entry fee to the group that has arranged to use the course, the fee charged normally includes lunch and the money goes to a good cause, and it generates more money for your club.

When an event is scheduled, it is listed on the club calendar, as you were told in your orientation, please check the club calendar on our website before planning or leaving home to come shoot.

Checking the calendar becomes even more important as the weather gets colder when snow and freezing rain are in the forecast!

New Clay Machines

We have just taken delivery of 5 new clay machines in addition to the 2 that were purchased earlier in the year. Some of you will have noticed that Station 2 now has 4 machines on it now. The plan for these machines is to have 2 on Station 16 (currently closed) and add an additional 2 to one of the other stations and have one as backup to rotate as machines come in for service.

Red Card

Sporting Clays remains open seven days a week for members with Red Cards. Red cards are available to members to obtain on Saturday's and Sunday's during Sporting Clays public hours.

Whether shooting red card during the week or out during public hour on the weekend, remember to sign in. Additionally make sure any guest you bring sign in and fill out indemnification forms.

Sporting Clays Safety Info!!!

If you are on the course and one of the clay machines does not fire, move on and make up at the next station and let the desk worker know. Please do not approach or touch the machines, when they are just sitting there, they are ready to launch, and any bump or jarring can release the arm and injury can occur.

PPC LEAGUE

The ANNUAL Fall PPC League continues every Monday evening this month and will run through the end of December. League times are 6PM - 9PM.

PPC is a fantastic activity for refining and developing the fundamentals of handgun shooting to help you improve your handgun skills. Open to members and the public you can join anytime during the season to shoot your 10 scores.

Continuing from last season is the new Unlimited Class which allows for any caliber pistol allowed on the indoor range from .22 and up as well as optics but no lasers.
