FLSC election of Board members, and Board of Directors

The election is open to all FLSC members in good standing, and is held on Tuesday, January 23rd, from 7:00-8:00 PM.

RANGE RULE HIGHLIGHT

The FLSC Range Rules are in important aspect of all of our activities at the Club. They promote safety, help reduce damage to and maintenance cost of the Club's facilities, and generally help everyone enjoy the Club as much as possible.

Our range rule highlight for this month are the caliber, load and bullet composition restrictions for the indoor range. These restrictions are prominently posted in the basement of the Clubhouse, and an be found on page four of the FSLC Range Rules.

Basically, most common pistol calibers, *except* for those with a "+P", "+P+", or "Magnum" designation are allowed, as well as rifles chambered in .17, and .22 caliber, as long as the manufacturer's stated velocity for the round is *less than* 1,000fps (feet per second), and the bullet is all lead, i.e., *no* jacketed rounds.

This rule is first, for safety, as our indoor range is not designed to safely handle the more powerful pistol and rifle rounds, so their use indoors might result in unpredictable and dangerous results such as round "splashback", or ricochet. Additionally, the more powerful rounds and/or unusual bullet materials cause excessive damage to the indoor range, which means greater costs for all the members of the Club.

Legal Notes

As the field of law is complex, ever-hanging, and affects us all, it helps to be abreast of the state of the law in Michigan, especially as it pertains to the sport of hunting, and firearms in general.

While this author, as an attorney, cannot give advice as to any specific course of action anyone should take, without there being an attorney and client relationship, it is certainly permissible to provide FLSC members, and the general public with information and legal analysis of legislation, court cases, and general news.

Of particular note are the three bills enacted into law by the Michigan legislature in regard to firearms. That is, the so-called "red-flag" law, the "safe storage" law, and the "universal background check" law. These laws did not become effective when Governor Whitmer signed them, but will do so ninety-one days after the current Michigan legislature adjourns, which is set for February 13, 2024. That means that the laws will be in effect as of April 14, 2024.

Each of these laws will be described and analyzed in future editions, as well as other topics, so keep your head on a swivel, and when in doubt, don't talk to the police!
